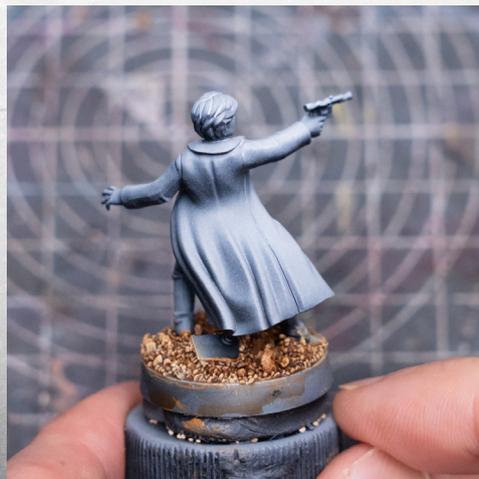
### HAN SOLO

PAINTING GUIDE BY SORASTRO

Hello! In this guide I'll be painting Han Solo from Star Wars: Legion!



As usual I've primed the figure in black followed with some grey and white zenithal highlights:



I'm starting with the eyes where I'm using an off white, followed with pure black for the surrounding area:



We can then use the black to place the pupils:



I'm now painting the skin using the Scalecolor Artist paints, as usual starting with a base-tone mix of Pink Flesh and Burnt Sienna Umber, then lightened up to a mid-tone mix of Pink and Golden Flesh. I also mixed in some Prussian Blue for the chin area.

We can then add Vanilla White for the brighter highlights. We'll also need to add a touch of red for the lips, and I also incorporated some Orange to create some richer mid tones.



Here I'm just placing my initial base tones:



I decided to use a photo of Harrison Ford as reference to help capture his likeness as best I could:



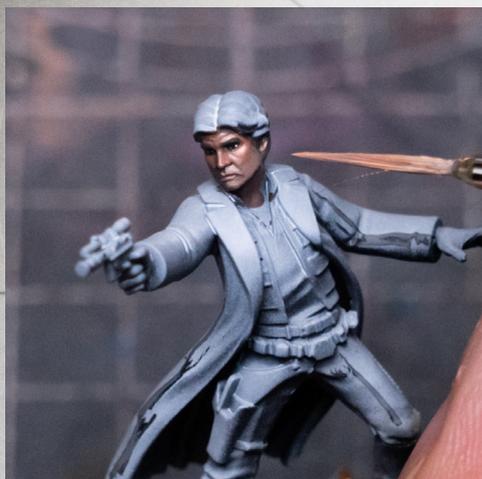
The photo I used has an off-centre overhead light source, producing a strong set of highlights on his left cheekbone, forehead etc.



You can see I've also articulated the little creases on the forehead, and around the nose and mouth area:



We can be pretty bold with the values here:



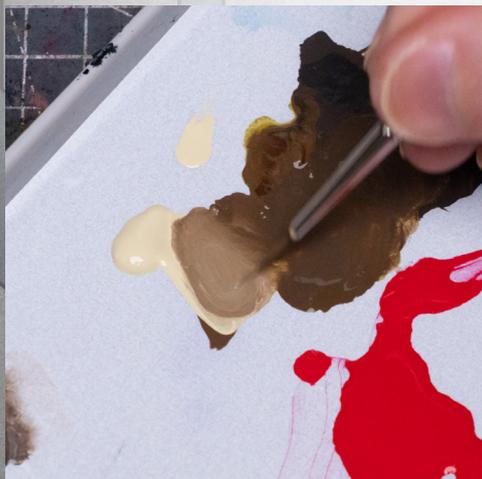
I'm now blocking in the base tone for the hair using a mix of Black Brown and Dark Golden Brown:



Here I've returned to add a little more orange into some of the mid tones of the skin, and I've also painted the neck area:



I'm now adding some Khaki into the hair base tone to begin adding some highlights:



I also added some Black into the base colour to create some darker tones in some of the recesses:



I'm now just going back and forth a little between pushing the highlights, and darkening the shadows, taking care to avoid him looking too fair or blonde:



Next I'm painting the hands:



I'm now painting the inner top using Khaki mixed with a little Black (although I later adjusted this to give it more of a beige tone):



Next I'm painting the black waist jacket, belt, boots, and blaster using Coal Black mixed with a little Dark Blue:



For the trousers I'm using Black Brown:



And I'm using Dark Umber for the holster:



I'm now going to sketch the main values in for the overcoat using Bright Brown Grey, and I'll be adding some Black Brown for the more shadowed areas:



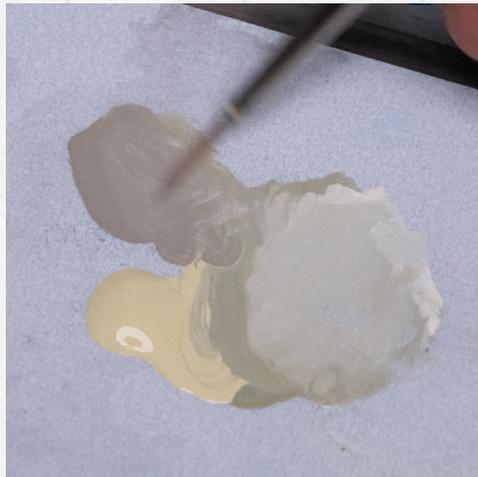
The blending doesn't need to be super smooth here as we'll be adding the camouflage overlay on top in a moment:



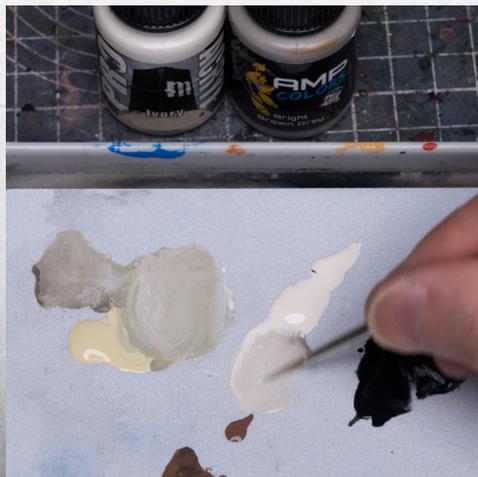
I'm now going to begin highlighting the outfit starting with the light top where I began using increasing amount of Khaki in the mix:



I felt this was looking a little too greenish however so mixed in some Bright Brown Grey, and also added some Ivory for the brighter values:



By brightest tone here is a mix of Ivory and the Bright Brown Grey:





Next we can add some Ivory to the Blue-Black base tone to highlight the waistcoat and belt:



I'm also using the same blue-ish grey scale to paint the metallic details, but going a lot brighter of course:



And I'm adding some Titanium White for the brighter highlights:



Moving on to the holster I'm first highlighting up to a mid tone of Burnt Umber from the Dark Umber base tone:



We can generate a nice bit of texture here whilst we work:



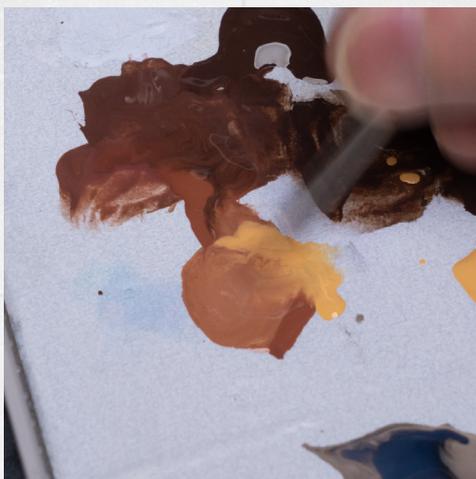
There's also a metallic detail here on the side of the belt:



And we can add a little black lining along the way:



For the brighter highlights I'm adding some Golden Brown:



Next I'm going to add some gentle highlights to the trousers by adding some Light Umber to the Black Brown base tone:



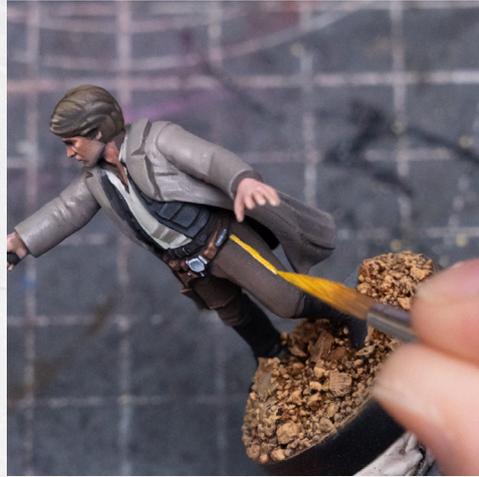
As this is a softer fabric compared to the leather holster we don't want to push the values as high:



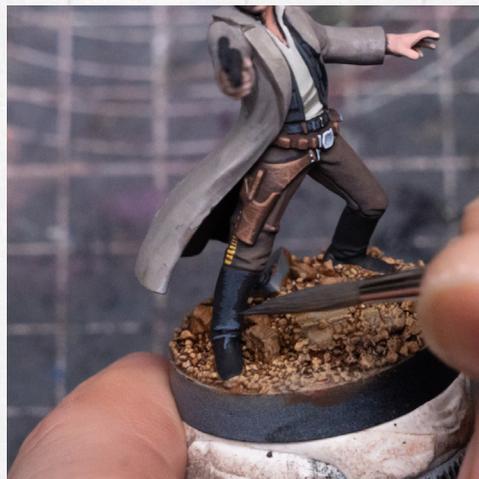
I'm now painting the yellow strips on the sides using a mix of Warm Yellow and Golden Brown:



We can then break the strip up into tiny segments using some Black Brown:



I'm now highlighting the boots using the same blue-ish grey scale used elsewhere:



After placing some bands of highlight, I'll often then use an intermediate tone to help blend the boarder between the two tones:



For the camouflage pattern on the overcoat I'm assembling a range of brown and grey tones:



I'm then simply painting on some patches of colour before blending the edges by mixing some of the Bright Brown Grey to create a somewhat diffuse look:



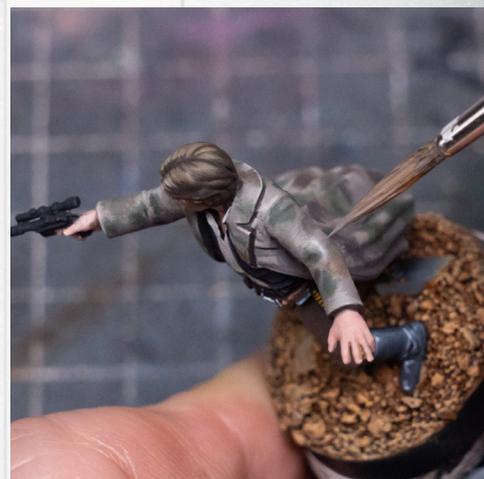
Here once again you can see me placing some patches of colour on the arm:



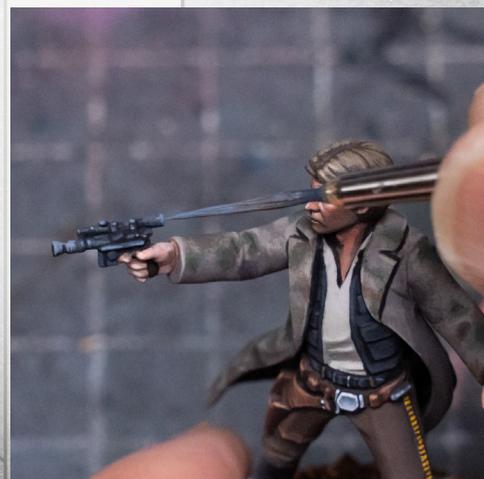
And here I've now blurred the edges:



We can also add a little Ivory to the Bright Brown Grey to boost one or two highlights:



I'm now returning to the blue-black grey scale to highlight the blaster pistol:

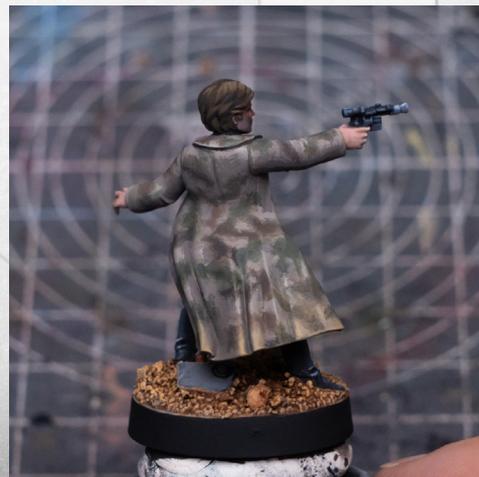


To finish the cloak off I decided to dry brush a little Golden Brown around the base to create a little dusty weathering:



Here I'm just painting the metallic debris on the base before painting the rim in black and providing some Ultra Matte Varnish:

And this completes Han Solo!
